Specific Area: Literacy

Dear Zoo, Hands's Surprise, Rumble in the Jungle, Giraffes Can't Dance, Little Polar Bear, Remarkable Animals, Over in Australia Making up stories with themselves as the main character. Record stories through picture drawing and sequencing/mark making/story maps and writing simple sentences. Letter writing

Alliteration to describe animals.

Read simple phrases and sentences made up of words with known letter–sound correspondences and a few exception words.

Alphabet song – lower and uppercase letters

Non-Fiction Focus - animals

Phonic Sounds: Phase 2 consolidation and Phase 3
Reading: Rhyming strings, identifying characters and settings.
Help children to become familiar with letter groups, such as 'th', 'sh', 'ch', 'ee' 'or' 'igh'. Read words containing familiar letter groups: 'that', 'shop', 'chin', 'feet', 'storm', 'night'
Picture and caption matching.
Phonics games

- o Compare animals from different habitats.
- o Explore a range of animals and their characteristics.
- o Zoo maps.
