



CURRICULUM Spring Term – Year 2

English

Writing: plan and write a fantasy quest story featuring a dragon, using dictionaries to find 'exciting' words, explore the features of an information texts and write a fact file about a dinosaur using the past tense. Constructing cinquains poems on the theme of animals.

Reading: explore the features of fiction and non-fiction/information texts, including the way these are laid out, contents and index pages, begin to use dictionaries and atlases appropriately.

Whole Class Reader: 'The Danger Gang' by Tom Fletcher. Become familiar with VIPERS and begin to use them to answer questions.

SPAG: making ambitious vocabulary choices, using 'and' and 'but' in the correct context, recognise the purpose and position of speech marks in written work, compound words, contractions e.g. do not = don't

Maths

Calculations: division facts for 2s, 5s and 10s, halving as the inverse of doubling, doubles of all numbers to 20 & corresponding halves, formal written number sentences using (x) and (\div) symbols, repeated addition

Measure: recognise all coins and notes, recognise and use (£) and (p) correctly, how many pence in £1, solve problems in a practical context including giving change

Time: minutes in an hour, hours in a day, days in each month, telling the time - quarter to and quarter past, progressing to 5-minute intervals

Shape: identify and describe the properties of 2D and 3D shapes, identify lines of symmetry in 2D shapes, sort shapes on the basis of their properties, including everyday objects.

Science

Animals incl. humans: baby animals and life cycles – offspring of a variety of different animals, how humans grow as they age. Life cycle of a human/frog/butterfly.

Environmental Science: Rocks and fossils – different types of rocks, how and why volcanoes form, three fossil types, how they are made and how old they are

Computing

Office: Laptop Navigation – to use basic computer skills incl. internet searches and keyboard skills, understand how to log onto their own one-drive and save work

Office: Introduction to Powerpoint – organise ideas for a paired/small group simple slide show presentation on dinosaurs (linked to English)

PSHE

Global Issues: Foods from around the world, customs and celebrations

People around us: people who help us, people and places around the world

Humanities

UK and map work: UK countries & aerial photos – name and locate the 4 countries of the UK on a map, label the places on a map of UK, compass points, aerial maps and how they relate to physical locations and items **Significant People/Events: Rosa Parks & Malala -Yousafzai, Mary Anning** – who they were, what they stood for and why they were important

RE

Christianity: Jesus' teachings of kindness, acceptance and forgiveness

Christianity: Easter (Resurrection) – seasons of the year (link to new life), symbols of easter, Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection

Art

Painting: Landscapes & Cityscapes — use paint and pastel to create colour, texture and line in a landscape & cityscape Design & Technology: Natural Sculpture — make a clay model of an natural object, observational drawing in nature, collect materials for a land art piece
